RESOLUTION DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City of Hattiesburg's governing authorities recognize the existence of a local emergency that may occur as a result of Tropical Storm Nate, predicted to upgrade to Hurricane status by the time of landfall in the early morning hours of Saturday, October 8, 2017; and,

WHEREAS, the governing authorities of the City of Hattiesburg recognize that this local emergency means the existence of conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons and properties within the City limits of the City of Hattiesburg caused by this storm; and,

WHEREAS, such conditions are beyond the normal control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities; and,

WHEREAS, this emergency is a result of a natural disaster and may resulting in loss of lives, injuries to the population, substantial damage and loss of property; and,

WHEREAS, this natural emergency will have been caused by a natural event, to wit: Tropical Storm/Hurricane Nate; and,

WHEREAS, this Resolution meets those requirements contained in Code Section 33-15-5 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended; and,

WHEREAS, in order to carry out the provisions of Code Section 33-15-17 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as annotated and amended, the City of Hattiesburg, through its governing authorities, is acting in accordance with the disaster relief as herein described;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Hattiesburg, Mississippi do hereby authorize the appropriate personnel to enter into contracts and incur obligations necessary to combat this disaster, protecting the health and safety of persons and property and providing emergency assistance to the victims of this disaster, and authorizing them to exercise those powers vested under Mississippi law, in light of the exigencies of the extreme emergency situation, without regard to time-consuming procedures and formalities prescribed by law pertaining to the performance of public work: entering into contracts, the incurring of obligations, the employment of temporary workers, the rental of equipment, the purchase of supplies and materials, and the appropriation and expenditure of public funds as outlined in Mississippi Code Section 33-15-17, sub-paragraph (B), (1972, as amended).

The governing authorities of the City of Hattiesburg, having declared a local emergency as defined in Mississippi Code Section 33-15-5 (1972 as amended), will review the need for continuing the local emergency at least every seven days until such local emergency is terminated and shall proclaim the termination of such local emergency at the earliest possible date that conditions warrant. During this emergency, the Mayor is hereby authorized to issue orders or regulations concerning the protection of life and property, including the imposition of a curfew within designated boundaries where necessary to preserve public order and safety. Such orders or regulations will be in writing and terminated in writing. Imposition of a curfew shall not be construed as restricting in any manner the existing authority to impose a curfew pursuant to police power for any other lawful purpose.

Further, the Mayor is authorized to act in accordance with Mississippi Code Section 33-15-49, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit “A”.

Section 1. That public interest and necessity requiring same, this Resolution shall become effective immediately.
